
CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE

Room 4 has had a busy, but lovely term 3 this year. We have continued to thrive in our classroom whilst welcoming new students and a new teacher, Miss Nuich. We are growing into the best versions of ourselves and continue to celebrate all of our achievements. We are successfully completing rotations in reading and mathematics with growing confidence; engaging in tasks that help us to demonstrate our critical and creative thinking in different contexts; writing compound sentences, using commas and are learning to write for a range of different purposes, such as to persuade and inform.





In Science and Technology, we have explored Biological Sciences including life cycles and


Biological Sciences including life cycles and the characteristics of living things. We explored the life cycles of humans, ducks, turtles and were even lucky enough to plant our very own sunflower seeds. Throughout the term, we watched our flowers grow, taking detailed observations and making judgements based on the stage of the sunflower's life cycle. This term was also Science Week where we investigated glass; how it's made and what it is used for.

In Humanities, we have been exploring history including artefacts, historical people, local places and changing technology. We have discovered a range of artefacts and technology from the past and how these have changed over time. Throughout the term, we have created some amazing pieces of work including a 'Wanted' poster for

Moondyne Joe and a travel brochure for Fremantle Prison, to share what these people and places can teach us about history.

We continue to nurture our wellbeing in Health classes, by discussing protective behaviours. 
